

Fundraising

General Instructions:

This task has three parts: Part 1 has one question; Part 2 has three questions and Part 3 has an essay - an argumentative article on a topic related to the sources.



Every day, different charities make phone calls, send letters, and knock on doors to ask people to donate money to a cause. Some of these causes are local in your community and directly affect you. Others are thousands of miles away in different continents. Which fundraising effort is more worthwhile and beneficial to people in general?

For this task, you will be writing an argumentative article related to the topic of fundraising. Before you write your article, you will review three sources that provide information about fundraising and give opposing viewpoints about whether local and global fundraising is more helpful.



Instructions to begin:

After you have reviewed these sources, you will write the important points from each source. Briefly scan the sources and the questions that follow. Then, go back and read the sources carefully to gain the information you will need to answer the questions and write an article.

In Part 3, you will write an argumentative article on a topic related to the sources.

You will now read the three sources. You may go back to any of the sources and the important points as often as you like.

Source 1

Fundraising Efforts

Fundraising and donating to charities can be a wonderful and rewarding experience for everyone involved. Many organizations rely a great deal on the money that is generated from fundraisers. Sometimes, this money is the only revenue that keeps the organization up and running. Without it, it is possible that the charity will no longer be able to function successfully.

When schools and companies decide to hold fundraisers, a couple of big decisions need to be made. First, they will need to come up with a creative event that will attract as many people as possible. Net, they will need to decide who will benefit from the money that is generated. This is usually the harder decision to make.

There are so many worthy causes that deserve the funds that are collected during an event. There are charities for people who are sick or homeless. There are also charities for animals that might have been abused or abandoned. Source 2

Local Fundraising

Successful place. Not only are you contributing to the cause, but you are also giving a little back to yourself.

Think of the following situation for a moment. You received a pamphlet in the mail from a wildlife fund in another country asking for a small donation. It seems like a worthy cause and you love animals, so why not? Before you decide to mail your donation, think about your local animal shelters. They take in stray animals from your own community and help them to find good homes. Think about how worried you would feel if your dog got out of your yard and could not find its way back home. Someone might bring your dag to the animal shelter where it would be taken care of until you came to retrieve it. Without these local shelters, stray animals might have to stay living as strays and there would be no place for someone to bring your pet if it should ever get lost. That wildlife fund in another country is probably a very good organization that is doing wonderful things for the animals it

protects but wouldn't it nice to see your contributions go to local organization that is doing something wonderful right where you live.

Source 3

There are charities that focus on providing nutritious food to these parts of the world. By giving people nourishing food to eat every day, it helps to keep whole communities healthy.

Thankfully, our country does a very good job helping the people that live here. It has many plans in place to try and protect Jamaicans from being hungry or having to live without medical care. If a disaster should occur, the government would step in and try to help in any way it could. Not every country can provide these things to its people. Therefore, it is so important for us to support the charitable organizations that can and do help people in less fortunate countries. These global charities help to change people's lives in ways we may never fully understand.

Instructions for Part 3

You may look back at the sources, your answers to the questions in Parts 1 & 2, and refer to the important points at any time, they will help you. Now read your assignment and the information about how your fantasy story will be scored; then begin your work.

Your assignment:

Your school is planning a fundraising event and trying to decide on a worthy cause. One group of students want to raise money to provide necessary supplies to the local animal shelter. Another group wants to raise money to send to an international organisation that provides supplies to restore school buildings around the world damaged by natural disasters. Decide which group you want to support and write a multi-paragraph article arguing for that group's preference. In your article, you will take a side whether you will raise money for a local or global charity. Your article will be read by the teachers and students at your school. In your article clearly state your argument and support your argument with reasons that thoroughly developed using information from the sources.

REMEMBER: Your argumentative article will be scored using the following:

- 1. Statement of purpose and organization: How well did you clearly state your opinions on the topic? How well did you maintain your focus?
- 2. **Organization**: How well did your ideas logically flow from the introduction to the conclusion? How often did you use effective transitions? How well did you stay on the topic throughout the article?
- 3. Elaboration and evidence: How well did you provide evidence from the sources about your argument? How well you elaborative with specific information?
- 4. Language and vocabulary: how well did you effectively express your ideas? How often did you use precise language appropriate for your audience and purpose?
- 5. **Conventions:** How well did you follow the rules of grammar, usage, punctuation, capitalization and spelling.

Now begin work on your argumentative article. Manage your time carefully so that you can:

- 1. Plan your multi-paragraph narrative
- 2. Write your multi-paragraph narrative
- 3. Revise and edit the final draft of multi-paragraph narrative

For **Part 2**, you are being asked to write a multi-paragraph narrative. Write your response on a separate sheet of paper. You may refer to your answers, important points and the sources.
